

Course: Academic Writing - A Practical Workshop

Pre-requisite: None

Abstract

This course will focus on your understanding of the principles of academic writing as well as key research concepts. Participants will be introduced to Harvard referencing and very importantly, how to avoid plagiarism. In addition, with the use of practical exercises students will develop a better understanding of the writing process and technique, and learn how to organize their ideas for the production of a required academic report.

Learning outcomes

On completion of this course, learners will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate an understanding of the research process as well as key reseach concepts
- 2. Recognise what constitutes plagiarism, how to avoid it, and how to effectively utilise the Harvard Referencing standard
- 3. Utilise an appropriate academic writing technique;
- 4. Understand the importance of an effective writing process, including how to source and review academic literature.
